This is the classroom.



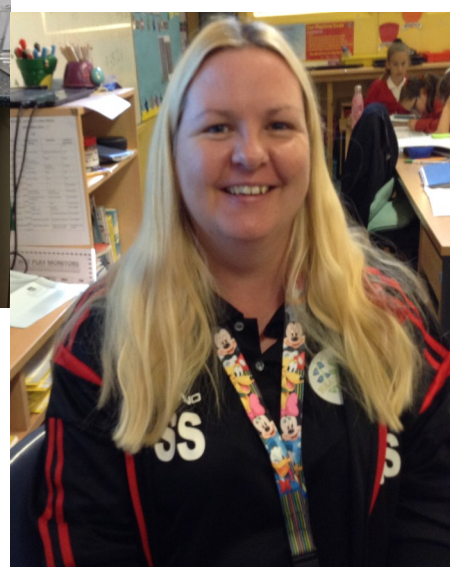
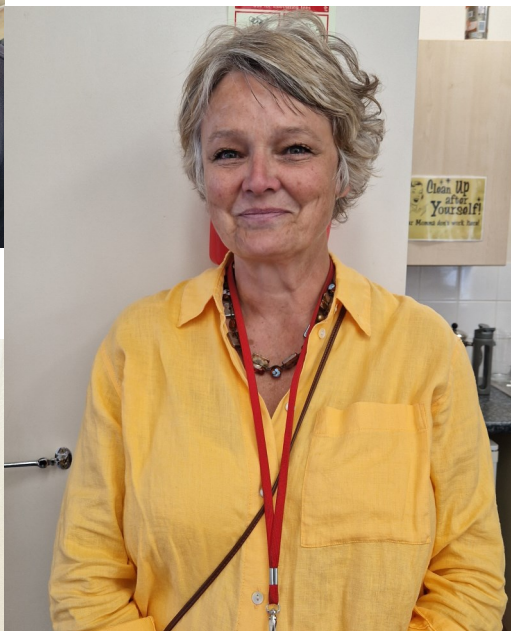
This is my teacher. His
